

6HX19-6.27 CONSEQUENCES OF STUDENTS' UNMET FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

The purpose of this Board Rule is to establish Board policy regarding the consequences of students' unmet financial obligations.

Students are expected to meet their student financial obligations. Academic transcripts or other student records will not be released until student financial obligations are met. Such financial obligations include, but are not limited to: library accounts, federal and state financial aid, including Pell, Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG), Florida Student Assistance Grant (FSAG), Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG), and Federal Direct Loan program overpayments/defaults, and veteran deferred payments.

A student who has a PHSC financial obligation outstanding will not be allowed to register, receive transcripts, or receive financial aid until the obligation is paid in full. Obligations that remain unpaid after multiple contact attempts with no response may be remitted to a collection agency for resolution. Any exceptions to this Rule must be made by the President or a designee.
