6Hx19-4.11 TRAFFIC AND PARKING REGULATIONS

The purpose of this Rule is to provide regulations for parking and traffic on all College property.

All persons on campus, including students, employees, and visitors shall:

- 1. Observe speed limits and traffic signs, to include but not limited to directional arrows and instructions marked on the surface of roads and parking areas.
- 2. Park vehicles only on hard surfaced areas within parking lots, and within designated parking spaces.
- 3. Not park or drive vehicles of any kind on grassed areas without prior approval of a Vice-President, the Campus Provost or the facilities department.
- 4. Not park in spaces marked for persons with disability without prominently displaying the appropriate State of Florida issued decal, tag or other documentation.
- 5. Promptly report accidents and other incidents involving vehicles to local law enforcement agencies.

Vehicular damage to College property shall be investigated and, where found to be at fault, the owner shall be responsible for reimbursing the College for the cost of repairing the physical damages.

The College will tow, at the owner's expense, vehicles parked in violation of these regulations or in a manner that impedes traffic flow or creates a safety hazard.

Students found to be in violation of these regulations may be subject to student disciplinary action in accordance with District Board of Trustees Rule 6Hx19-6.13.

Employees found to be in violation of these regulations may be subject to disciplinary action

in accordance with District Board of Trustee Rule 6Hx19-2.59.

The College may utilize the services of local law enforcement for purposes of enforcing any provisions of this Pulo
