6Hx19-6.16 LOITERING OR SOLICITING ON COLLEGE PROPERTY

The purpose of this Board Rule is to establish Board policy relating to loitering and solicitation at College campuses and teaching locations

Loitering

It is unlawful for any person to loiter or prowl in a place, at a time or in a manner not usual for law-abiding individuals, under circumstances that warrant a justifiable and reasonable alarm or immediate concern for the safety of persons or property in the vicinity. Loitering at any College campus, or at any other teaching location, will not be permitted. Any person suspected of loitering will be asked to leave the College premises, and upon refusal, law enforcement will be contacted by College Officials.

Solicitation

Soliciting includes, but is not limited to, any distribution, circulation, posting or publishing any handbill, written advertisement, ticket sale information or other publication. The posting of unauthorized publications on College bulletin boards and windshields of vehicles is strictly prohibited. The College President or designee must approve any and all requests for solicitation.
